Fall Mini Quilt Sew Along 2025

Darting Birds Quilt

Finished block: 4 ½" x 4 ½"

Welcome to another mini quilt sew along! We'll be making a very simple and scrappy quilt this time using a little block called Darting Birds. You'll have several options for making your quilt. You can make a six-block quilt or a nine-block quilt. OR, you can make a quilt using smaller 3" blocks. (Directions for those blocks are listed below.) Whichever quilt you decide to make, each block will use scraps of 3 different prints - light, medium and dark colors. No cut piece you will be larger than 3" x 3" (unless you count the borders) but you may need to cut several squares from the same print for the same block. Let's get started!

Materials

Assorted reproduction fabric scraps in light, medium and dark prints to make the blocks. Fabric for borders if desired. Depending upon how wide you like your borders, 1/8 yd of fabric should be enough.

Cutting for each 4 ½" block

From a light print, cut

1 square 2" x 2"

3 squares, 2 3/8" x 2 3/8"

From a medium print, cut

1 square 2" x 2"

1 square, 2 3/8" x 2 3/8"

From a dark print, cut

1 square 2" x 2"

2 squares, 2 3/8" x 2 3/8"

Make the Block


1. To make the half square triangles, layer one light print 2 3/8" square on top of a medium print 2 3/8" square, right sides together. Next, layer 2 light print 2 3/8" squares on top of 2 dark print 2 3/8" squares, right sides together. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner across the back of each light square. Stitch 1/4" from the line on both sides and cut on the drawn line. Flip open and press seams toward the darker fabric. Make six half-square triangle units, 2 medium and light and 4 dark and light. Trim each unit to 2 ½" x 2 ½".





Make 6 units.

2. Arrange the HST (half-square triangle) units together with the light, medium and dark print 2 ½" squares as shown. Sew three units together into three rows. Sew the rows together to make the block. Decide on a setting for your blocks and then make as many blocks as you like for your quilt.





Make 6 or 9 blocks.

If you're feeling adventurous and want to go even smaller with your blocks, here are instructions for a 3" \times 3" block. Following the cutting directions for the 4 ½" blocks above, substitute 1 ½" squares for the 2" squares, and 1 7/8" squares for the 2 3/8" squares. Then assemble the same way.

Assemble the Quilt

Sew your blocks together into rows, arranging them to look like a flock of darting birds. Add borders if you like by measuring your top and cutting strips the same length. I often cut strips 2 ½" wide for my small quilt borders. This will give a finished border of 2".
