Add the borders

Before you add borders, make sure your block is squared up and measures $7 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $7 \frac{1}{2}$ ".

You can finish your little quilt any way you like. Here are a few options -



Simple finish: 9 ¾" x 9 ¾" finished quilt

Option 1: Cut 2 strips from light blue fabric, 2" x 7 ½". Sew strips to the sides of your block.

Cut 2 light blue strips, 2" x 9 ¾". Sew to the top and bottom of quilt.

Layer quilt top, batting and backing. Pin or thread baste the layers together. Quilt by hand or machine.

For binding: Cut a red strip 1 ¼" wide and sew a single-fold binding.



Scrappy border: 9 3/4" x 9 3/4" finished quilt

Option 2: Cut 2 red fabric strips, 2" x $7 \frac{1}{2}$ ". Sew to the sides of your block. Cut 2 strips from a blue fabric, 2" x $9 \frac{3}{4}$ ". Sew to the top and bottom of quilt.

Layer quilt top, batting and backing. Pin or thread baste the layers together. Quilt by hand or machine.

For binding: Cut a dark blue strip 1 ¼" wide and sew a single-fold binding.



Four-patch border: 10 ¾" x 10 ¾" finished quilt

Option 3: Cut 4 blue fabric strips, 2 ½" x 7 ½". Sew two strips to the sides of your block.




Cut 8 squares from a red print, $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $1 \frac{1}{2}$ ". Cut 8 squares from a light print, $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $1 \frac{1}{2}$ ". Make a four-patch block that measures 2 ½" x 2 ½". Make four blocks.



Make 4.

Sew two four-patch units to both ends of a $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $7 \frac{1}{2}$ " strip as shown (so that the red squares are pointing outward). Make 2 strips.



Sew the strips with four-patch blocks to the top and bottom of the quilt.

Layer quilt top, batting and backing. Pin or thread baste the layers together. Quilt by hand or machine.

For binding: Cut a dark blue strip 1 ¼" wide and sew a single-fold binding.

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
