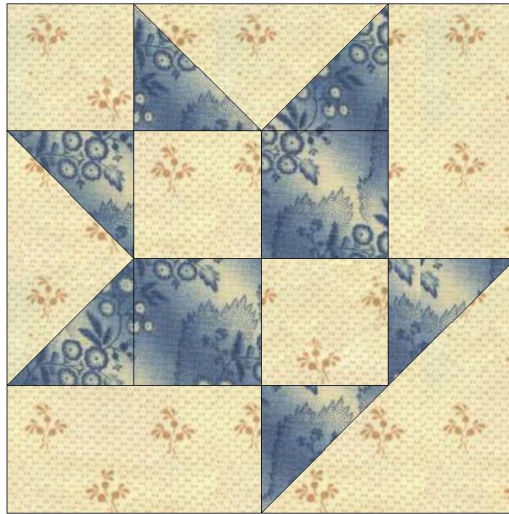


Aunt Addie's Blue Ribbon Quilt

Kathleen Tracy's 2019 Mystery Quilt - Block # 4



Baby Bunting

Finished block size: 4" x 4"

MAKE SIX BLOCKS

Materials

Scraps of light or medium prints

Scraps of medium or dark prints

Cutting

From a light print scrap, cut

3 squares $1\frac{1}{2}''$ x $1\frac{1}{2}''$

4 rectangles $1\frac{1}{2}''$ x $2\frac{1}{2}''$

1 square $2\frac{7}{8}''$, cut once on diagonal

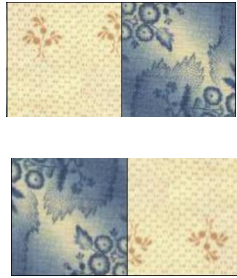
From a medium or dark print, cut

6 squares $1\frac{1}{2}''$ x $1\frac{1}{2}''$

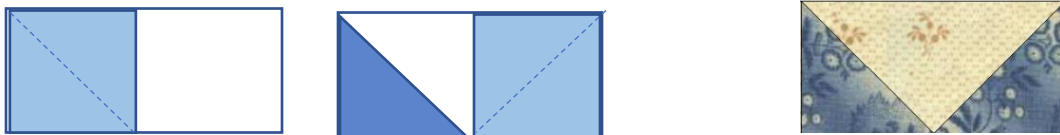
1 square $1\frac{7}{8}''$, cut once on diagonal for 2 triangles

Make the Block

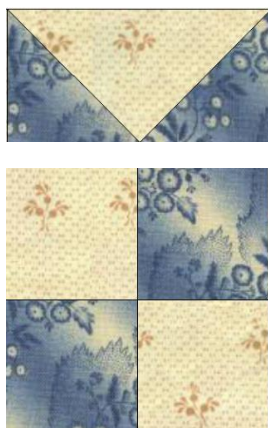
1. For each block, sew a 1 ½" medium or dark print square together with a 1 ½" light print square. Make two units. Sew the pieces together as shown to make a four-patch unit.



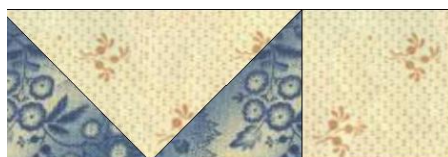
2. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong sides of four matching medium or dark print 1 ½" squares. Place one marked square on one end of a 1 ½" x 2 ½" light print rectangle, right sides together. Stitch on the marked line. Trim ¼" from the stitching line. Flip and press seam allowance toward the corner. Place another marked square on the other end of the rectangle and repeat. Make 2 flying geese units.



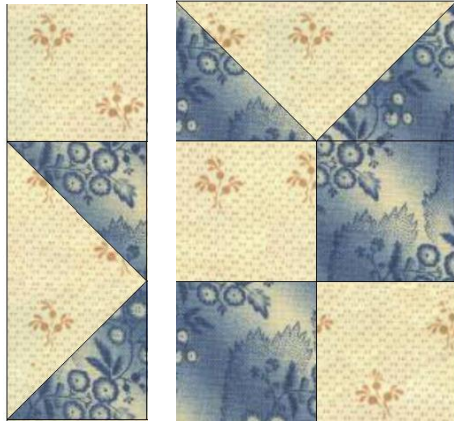
3. Sew one unit from step 2 to the top of the four-patch unit in step 1.



4. Sew the remaining flying geese unit to a 1 ½" light print square.



5. Sew the unit above to the side of the four-patch unit.



6. Sew the $1\frac{7}{8}$ " triangles to the light print $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles as shown.

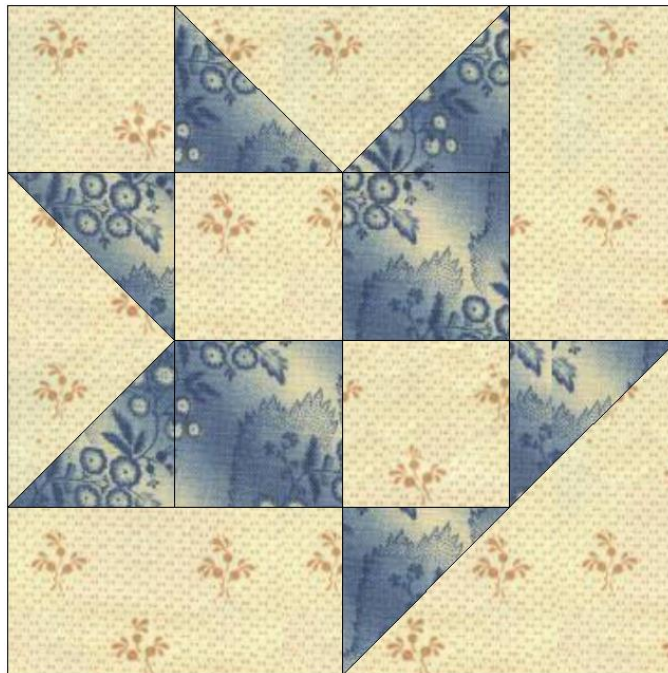

7. Line the units up with the four-patch and flying geese unit and sew together as shown. (The points of the triangles will overlap.) Add the light print $2\frac{7}{8}$ " triangle to the bottom to complete the block.
